By giving up this Senate project, it is better for the Jefferson City Jaycee chapter as they are able to profit with no risk. The risk is on the new group and Jefferson City Jaycees have a guarantee profit. When the prior chairman and the former board ran the number for the Senate to continue to run the project, the value equation did not work! In May, you as Missouri Senators voted to pass on the offer from Jefferson City Jaycees for the MO JCI Senate to guarantee a payment to the Jaycees and run the BBQ stand at Cole County fair (Jefferson City Jaycees provided the Senate the same opportunity as the other organization’s offer).

The Strassenfest organization has cancelled the celebration in 2011 so the Food Stand proceeds will not be an opportunity for the MO JCI Senate organization.

We started out the 2011-2012 with a minimal start-up of \$2000 from prior year proceeds. We have monies in the bank – savings and CDs but we must vote to use those monies.

However, we currently have NO DEBT andWe can raise money!

So for all those folks who keep saying “I’d rather donate” big \$\$\$\$\$\$, than labor at this or that hot project! “My time is worth more than we make”. 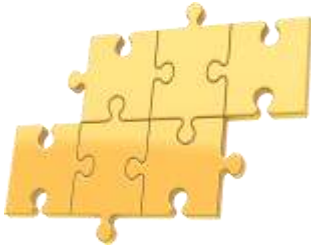

USJCI Senate Scholarship

Each year, the U.S. JCI Senate Foundation ("the Foundation") grants \$1,000 scholarships to graduating high school seniors who plan to continue their education at accredited post-secondary colleges, universities or vocational schools. The number of grants awarded annually is at the discretion of the Foundation and must be used for educational expenses in the first year of full-time study. Checks awarded will be made out in the name of the recipient and the educational institution of the recipient's choice.

Applications must come from high school students who are U.S. Citizens graduating from U.S. accredited schools. This may include state approved home school and state approved GED programs, cyber schools, and overseas U.S. approved schools.

From September to November of each year, each JCI Senate **state** organization (or foundation) distributes to schools and boards of education throughout their state the necessary application forms for determination of the recipients of scholarship grants. The deadline for return of the completed application forms to the state chairperson is at his or her individual discretion, and can vary from as early as December 1st to as late as the following January 15th. The deadline is shown on each state's application cover page.

An outside, independent panel of judges reviews each application received in each state and the two top ranked applications per state are forwarded to the Foundation. Another outside, independent panel of educators reviews the applications submitted from the states and the winners of the scholarship grants are selected by that panel.

Qualifications for the Foundation's scholarship grants are as stated above. No limit is set on the number of grant applications that can be submitted by students attending any given secondary educational institution. Although applications are judged at the state level first, eligibility is based on a student's state of residence rather than the location of the college, university, or vocational school the student plans to attend.

The Missouri JCI Senate presents two \$250 scholarship rewards each year to the two top ranked applicants that we forward on to the USJCI Foundation for consideration of the \$1,000 additional scholarship.

The 2011 – 2012 application for these scholarships will be available on-line on the Missouri JCI website soon. In September, emails will be sent to approximately 600 high schools across Missouri telling them about the available Missouri and USJCI Senate scholarships.

US JCI Senate Foundation

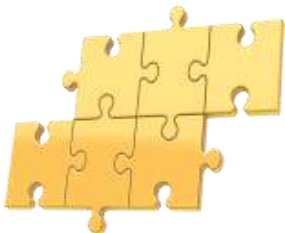
Dear Missouri JCI Senators,

I would just like to take a few moments of your time to bring you up to date on the US JCI Senate Foundation. We give 15 \$1000 scholarships to High School Seniors each year and last year Missouri was very fortunate to receive two of the scholarships. The way we raise money to give the scholarships is from donations from Senators all across the country and from State and Region Senate organizations. We only use the interest from all the money we raise to give the scholarships to ensure the program keeps going year after year.

Missouri has many members of the Foundation and we appreciate all of your support but we can always use new members and existing members to go to new donation levels. One of the new programs we have is the 200 club you buy a \$10 ticket (or 6 for \$50 and the \$50 is credited to your account) and you have 4 chances per month to win, we give 1-\$100 prize, 1-\$50 prize and 2-\$25 prizes each month and your number stays in for the whole year. The first drawing was in June but there are still ten months to go.

KEN MOORE #12909

Ken Moore #12909, joined the Jefferson City Jaycees and served as President in 1966 before being elected as a Missouri Jaycees Regional Vice President and then went on to become the first Executive Vice President of the Missouri Jaycees back when the State Headquarters was located in Sedalia.

It is interesting to note that the building that was built as the first Missouri Jaycees State Headquarters was just torn down about a year ago. It was out east of Sedalia near the airport just before you go under the railroad bridge. It had been more recently used at times by the Sedalia Jaycees.

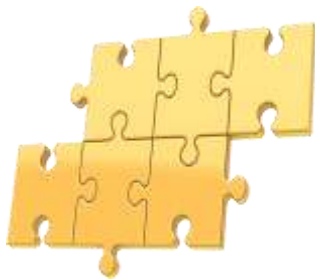
During his Jaycees days, Ken helped form the institutional chapter at the Missouri State Penitentiary in Jefferson City. This was quite an interesting challenge at the time and he was so glad that they didn't try to keep him there. The Cole County Fair project was going well at that time. The Jefferson City Jaycees had just sold their original property and had just moved to their present location with plans for a bigger and better Fair.

Ken left Missouri shortly after he received his Senatorship in 1971. In 1976, Ken took a position with the Norman, OK Chamber of Commerce. He says that one of the reasons that he got the job was because one of the members of the selection committee was a local banker and a Jaycee member. He knew about the Senate

recognition and later said "If you are a JCI Senator you must be something special." He worked in Norman for 10 great years.

Overall, Ken has served as President and CEO of Chambers of Commerce in Missouri, Kansas, Oklahoma, California, and Virginia, over a 42 year professional career. He emphatically states that he wouldn't be working in the profession if it weren't for the Jaycees.

Ken currently is the President and CEO of the Edmond, OK Chamber. He was happy to hear from us again and has become one of our newest "old" members. 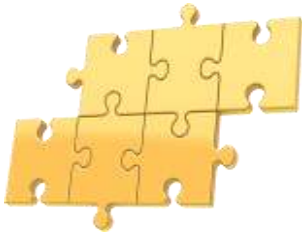

USJCI Senate Return the Favor Program

This is an “in hand” deadline and electronic submissions are encouraged.

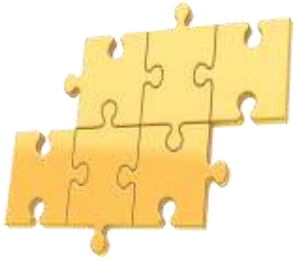
Fun In The Sun 4

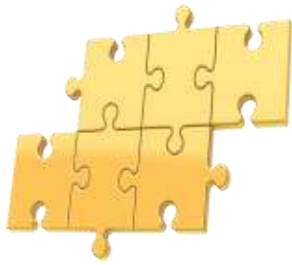

Edna I. Job, mother of Linda Job Scmitt #58024, passed away on June 11, 2011.

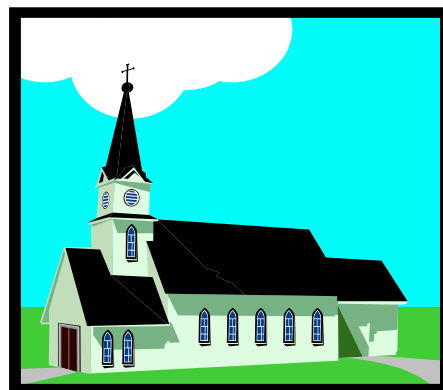

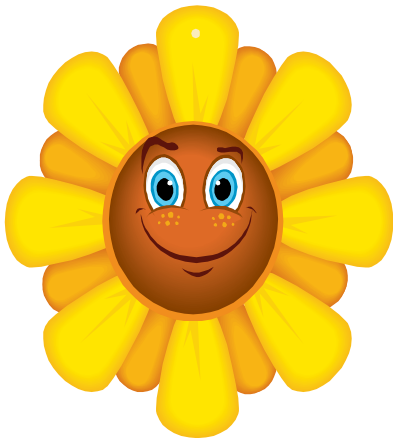

Please bring:

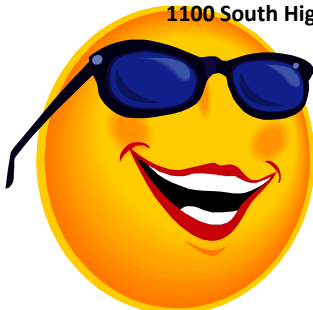
- Something to share with others for lunch such as a salad, chips/dip, dessert, etc.
