## Where Are They Now? Al Murfin #12760

Al Murfin held several positions in the Gladstone Jaycees before being elected as President in 1966-67. He was the National Director for Region III in 1968-69 and was a Clint Dunagan Memorial Award winner at the National Jaycee Convention in St. Louis. He was Missouri State First Vice President in 1969-70 and then served as Missouri State President in 1970-71. Also, he was elected as a National Vice President of the U.S. Jaycees in 1971-72 and joined the U.S. Jaycees Staff as the first Regional Director for the Northeast Region and moved to Northboro, Massachusetts. In 1974 Al moved back to Tulsa, as the Training Director at the U.S. Jaycee Headquarters and later served as the Director of Services, Executive Director of Services, and as the Executive Vice President prior to leaving the staff in December of 1975 to accept the position of Executive Vice President of the Columbia, Missouri, Chamber of Commerce. He held that position for seven years before moving to Texas. In addition, Al also served on the Wonderland Camp Foundation Board of Directors in 1968-71 and again in 1978-82.

He received several awards and honors from the Gladstone Jaycees and the Missouri Jaycees during his active Jaycee years. Gladstone presented him with his Senatorship #12760 in 1970. Currently he is a member of the Texas JCI Senate. Also, he received his U.S. Jaycee Ambassadorship #260 in 1977. Concerning memorabilia, he says "I regret to inform you that I sent most of my Jaycee awards and other materials to the U.S. Jaycee Headquarters several years ago for the U.S. Jaycee Archives. I can only hope that they are still being held by the national organization somewhere, however I doubt it."

The most interesting piece of information we got from Al was this, "One other point, I don't recall the actual date but I and a couple of other Jaycees were sitting in the bar at one of the Missouri Jaycee Board meetings having a drink before the meeting when a gentleman sitting near us asked if we were Jaycees. When we told him who we were he said that a friend had mentioned to him that he should contact the Jaycees if he really wanted to get his Wonderland Camp project off the ground. We invited Charlie Miller to come to the meeting and tell us about his dream about Wonderland Camp. He made a presentation to the Board and his dream became a reality as you know and that was 40 years ago. Each Jaycee Region at that time committed to building a cabin and we had Jaycees from Kansas City that did the architectural drawings for the cabins and the entire camp layout."

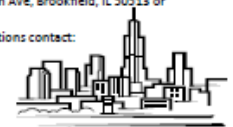
